

Medicare Supplement in the State of Florida

Covered Lives*

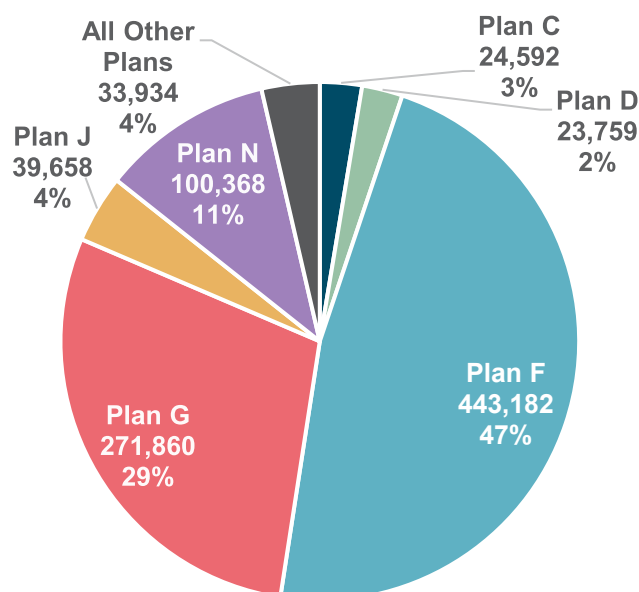
- **937,353** Florida residents had Medicare Supplement (also called Medigap) coverage in 2024.
- This represented **42.1%** of traditional (fee-for-service) Medicare beneficiaries in Florida.
- Nationally, **42.9%** of traditional Medicare beneficiaries have Medigap.

High Satisfaction**

- More than 9 out of 10 seniors agree that their Medicare Supplement plan allows them to receive high quality care (94%), protects them against unexpected, unpredictable medical costs (91%), and makes it easier to handle medical bills and paperwork (93%).
- Seniors overwhelmingly express high levels of satisfaction with the services offered and benefits covered by their Medicare Supplement plans (95%), the communications received from providers (84%), and the value received for the monthly premium (86%).
- 91% of seniors indicated the prospect of losing their Medicare Supplement coverage would cause them worry about losing financial security.

Medicare Supplement Enrollees by Plan Type in Florida*

- **Plan G** (covering 29% of state enrollees) and **Plan N** (covering 11% of state enrollees) saw the greatest growth in Florida from 2023 to 2024.
- Nationally, **Plan G** had the highest number of enrollees, covering 43% of policyholders in 2024.
