

Medicare Supplement in the State of Kansas

Covered Lives*

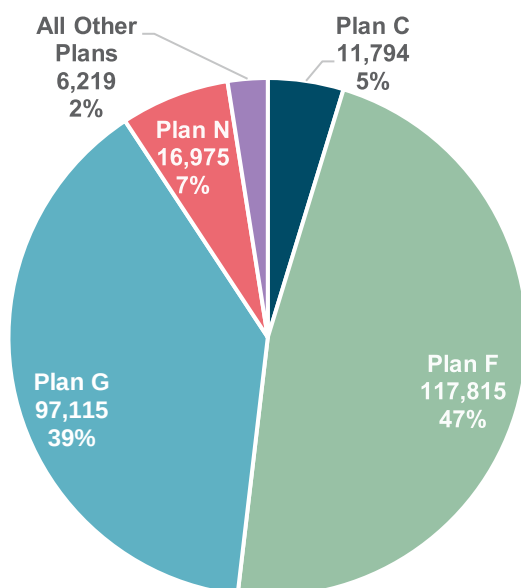
- **249,918** Kansas residents had Medicare Supplement (also called Medigap) coverage in 2021.
- This represented **60.3%** of traditional (fee-for-service) Medicare beneficiaries in Kansas.
- Nationally, **40.9%** of traditional Medicare beneficiaries have Medigap.

High Satisfaction**

- More than 9 out of 10 seniors agree that their Medicare Supplement plan allows them to receive high quality care (95%), protects them against unexpected, unpredictable medical costs (91%), and makes it easier to handle medical bills and paperwork (93%).
- Seniors overwhelmingly express high levels of satisfaction with the services offered and benefits covered by their Medicare Supplement plans (94%), the communications received from providers (81%), and the value received for the monthly premium (84%).
- 85% of seniors indicated the prospect of losing their Medicare Supplement coverage would cause them worry about losing financial security.

Medicare Supplement Enrollees by Plan Type in Kansas*

- **Plan G** (covering 39% of state enrollees) and **Plan N** (covering 7% of state enrollees) saw the greatest growth in Kansas from 2020 to 2021.
- Nationally, **Plan F** had the highest number of enrollees, covering 41% of policyholders in 2021.
